Holy Trinity

Trinity Sunday will be celebrated on Sunday, May 26, 2024. The Athanasian Creed, which was written by an anonymous author in the 5th century, is the Church's confession of the Holy Trinity. On Trinity Sunday, the Church proclaims the Christian faith through the words of the Athanasian Creed.

"The Athanasian Creed declares that its teachings concerning the Holy Trinity and our Lord's incarnation are 'the catholic faith." In other words, this is what the true Church of all times and all places has confessed. More than fifteen centuries later, the Church continues to confess this truth, confident that the triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, has given Himself for our salvation."

The altar will be adorned with white, which is the color of purity and completeness. This color assists in bearing the message that "though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be white as snow." Christ's triumph from the grave on Resurrection Day is the cause for our rejoicing. His purity before his Father becomes our purity. White reinforces that message of joy.

St. Mark's Lutherans For Life Message

"For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb." Psalm 139:13. How did it feel to hear mom say, "I love you"? How did it feel when your mom carried you? Did she ever tell you how you moved and stretched while she carried you during those nine months? Did she smile as she changed your diaper or when you blew out your birthday candles Your mom spoke the first words you heard. She said, "I love you. You are mine." If you were baptized in the first days or weeks after delivery, you also had the Word of God spoken to you. Your faith was given to you, and you began to grow in Christ as it says in Romans 10:17 "...faith comes from hearing...the Word of God." You were adopted into God's Kingdom and His family as a forgiven child.

Some women cannot conceive or bear children, but, even in these painful circumstances, God can work miracles. He has often used these women's gifts to reach, raise, and serve the children of loved ones, friends, and even strangers. Children are among the defenseless without a voice in this world. We have all grieved over the loss of a loved one, and the loss of a child or grandchild can often feel particularly difficult. Some people suffer silently from an abortion in their past. Open Hands

Liturgical scholar Balthasar Fischer (1912-2001) shared an "a-ha" realization about the significance of praying with open, outstretched hands, an ancient practice. The opposite gesture, a closed fist, is used to threaten others or even inflict violence. We also grasp things in closed fists, refusing to let go, to share, to hold gently or loosely.

When we pray with open hands, Fischer explained,

we're saying before God that we renounce "all highhandedness, all pride in [our] own sufficiency, all violence." We hold up our empty hands to God, saying, "I have nothing that I have not received from you, nothing that you have not placed in my empty hands. Therefore I do not keep a frantic hold on anything you have given me; therefore, too, I desire not to strike and hurt but only to give and to spread happiness and joy."
