
Disaster Response

Diaper Drive



Don't Be Root-Bound

As a new gardener, Jan Riggenbach used to treat bedding plants with extreme care, setting them into soil without disturbing the roots. Eventually she learned that rough — even ruthless — treatment is better in the long run.

"If the plant has been growing in its pot so long that the roots are circling the bottom, I jab my finger into the bottom of the soil and pull down to untangle the roots," Riggenbach

wrote in her gardening column. "If the whole pot is filled with circling roots, I have to be merciless. I don't worry if I break some of the roots. That's better than allowing the roots to continue to circle when the plants are growing in the garden."

In the same way, it's easy to grow complacent and inward-focused in our walk with God. But bunched-up roots can't reach out for sustenance. So for maximum faith growth, dare to let God shake you up from time to time!



St. Mark's is starting a homeschool ministry this fall. Starting in September, the St. Mark's Homeschool Co-op will begin meeting. This ministry serves members of the church and members of the community from Eureka and surrounding areas. This ministry will be led by Hope Rusnak.

The Co-op will meet on Mondays. The class periods will run from 1:00 p.m. - 4:15 p.m. and there will be an optional lunch period starting at 12:00. We will have two class terms that will be 12 weeks long. Our first term will begin on September 9 and end on November 25. The second 12 week term will begin on January 27 and end on April 14. The classes for the first term are music, art, and P.E., we will also have chapel and an optional lunch period each week.

Nursery care will be provided for babies 6 weeks—2 years old, and a pre-school class will be offered for kids ages 3-5.

The structure of the co-op will serve and engage the whole family. Parents who are not teaching will serve by caring for the nursery kids, playing and learning with the preschool class, being a teacher's assistant in the classes with older kids, or leading a parent Bible study.

There will be a family fun night each month. Twice per term, a parent education class will be held with provided childcare. We will have social events in December and January, during the time with no class terms. Throughout the year, we will plan other events like educational outings, park dates, and other social activities.
