

- While removing the seeds and pulp, pray, "Remove the things in my life that don't please you. Forgive the wrong things I do and help me forgive others." (See Matthew 6:14-15.)
- While making eyes, pray, "Open my eyes to see the beauty you've made in the world around me." (See Psalm 104:24.)
- While making the nose, pray, "I'm sorry for the times I've turned up my nose at your many gifts." (See James 1:17.)
- While making the mouth, pray, "Let everything I say please you." (See Psalm 19:14.)
- While lighting the candle, pray, "Lord, help me shine your light to others through the things I do." (See Matthew 5:16.)


Book Club

Voter Information

Election Day is fast approaching this November 5th. While most of our attention is probably focused on the presidential race, there is another issue on the state ballot that is profoundly important for us in the church, as we seek to show God's love to unborn children. Amendment 3 of the Missouri ballot, also known as "The Right to Reproductive Freedom Initiative," would

forbid any government restrictions on a person's "reproductive freedoms," a term intentionally left vague and broad that includes the permittance of abortions.


As King David writes, before we were born, we were fearfully and wonderfully made by God (Psalm 139:13-16), and we, as children of God, are called to show His love to these unborn babies. In the face of Amendment 3, we can show God's love to these babies by using our votes to protect them.

Likewise, we are called to show love to the mothers of



these unborn babies. Instead of working to drive an irreversible wedge between mother and unborn child, loving them may instead look like helping parents to appreciate their child as the God-given gift that they are. Loving them might also look like praying for and supporting them as they face the challenges of pregnancy and motherhood.

A "No" vote on Amendment 3 would serve as a means of showing Christ's love to both babies and mothers who are in the midst of a pregnancy.
