

# **Challenges for LIFE in 2025**

This is an update from your St. Mark's Life Team! These are some of the challenges for the Pro-Life Movement in the coming year – reasons for care, prayer, and sharing!

- Chemical pill abortions are becoming more and more common:
  - ⇒ In 2023, 60+% of abortions were by the abortion pill; in 2024, nearly 80%; and the percentage will probably rise in 2025.
  - ⇒ Therefore, the closest "abortion clinic" for abortion-minded women is their mailbox, website, and possibly soon a local pharmacy.
  - ⇒ Complications are 4x more likely with the pill than with an abortion procedure.
- Mis-information is prevalent:
  - ⇒ "Abortion is health care".
  - ⇒ Women are being told to tell hospital emergency rooms when complications require medical attention, "I'm having a miscarriage, **not** I took the chemical abortion pill".

These are just some of the reasons for us who care about "affirming life at every stage" to pray; and to reach out and care for those who are struggling with life issues. Be alert to these opportunities.



## Christian Symbols

A censer (or thurible) is a vessel for burning incense during worship. Eastern Orthodox and Roman Catholic churches, as well as some Protestant ones, often do this on special occasions. Censers come in many sizes, shapes and designs. A worship leader may swing a chain censer to waft the fragrant smoke over the congregation during a procession or benediction. As incense burns in a censer and smoke wafts upward, it symbolizes prayers of the faithful, floating to God. "May my prayer

be set before you like incense; may the lifting up of my hands be like the evening sacrifice" (Psalm 141:2, NIV).
